IF CLAUSE: If + subject + simple past,
RESULT CLAUSE: subject + would / could / might + have + past participle

a) (Janine / be inflexible) (she / be more open to new ideas)

If Janine wasn't inflexible, she would have been open to new ideas.

b) (Steve / be clumsy) (he / can spill coffee on his paperwork)

If Steve wasn't clumsy, he wouldn't have spilled coffee on his paperwork.

c) (Joyce / be promoted) (she / be a productive person)

Joyce wouldn't have been promoted, if she wasn't a productive person.

d) (I / outgoing) (I / go out more often)

If I was/were outgoing, I would have gone out more often.

e) (My cousin / be childish) (I / probably rely on him)

If my cousin wasn't / weren't clumsy, I would probably have relied on him.

f) (Lanna / be better humored) (she / be more grateful)

If Lanna was/were better humored, she would have been more grateful.

Complete the sentences using a past modal of deduction with the verbs given in the correct form. (1 POINT)

Old Mr. McGraw had been murdered and everybody was wondering who might have done (do) it. Two police officers were speculating about the murder.

SEBASTIAN: It must have been (be) Mrs. McGraw. I'm totally convinced it was her. She absolutely hated him. She might have used (use) a kitchen knife as the murder weapon, or maybe an axe from the garden tools.

JESSICA: It can't have been (be) Mrs McGraw. She isn't strong enough to drag the body and put it in the car boot. It must have been (be) their older son; I would bet all my money it was him. He had motive, because Mr. McGraw had disinherited him long ago, and everybody knew they hated each other.

SEBASTIAN: Impossible. It can't have been (be) their older son because he has a plausible alibi. He was fishing with his brother at the time of the crime, he testified.

JESSICA: Then the younger son might / must have lied (lie) to protect his brother. They might have agreed (agree) on an alibi after the murder. If you think about it, they might have planned (plan) the murder together. It's a reasonable possibility. Maybe the younger son was afraid that his father would disinherit him too; they had a difficult relationship.

SEBASTIAN: That makes sense. They killed him so that at least one of them could get the inheritance.

JESSICA: Well, if they wanted to get the money from the inheritance, they shouldn't have killed their father. Because now we'll catch them and they will be in prison and without a penny.
