### **The man that gave up being a billionaire**

Yvon Chouinard, the founder of the company Patagonia, did something important in September 2022. He decided not to be a billionaire anymore. He gave control of Patagonia to a trust and a nonprofit organization called Holdfast Collective. This nonprofit works to solve environmental problems. Chouinard shared this news in a letter on Patagonia's website, showing how much he cares about the environment.

Patagonia started in the 1970s when Chouinard sold rugby shirts to climbers. Since 1985, the company has given 1% of its sales to support environmental groups in the U.S. and around the world. In 2017, Patagonia made \$800 million in sales, proving that people liked the brand and its commitment to the environment.

In 2013, Patagonia started Tin Shed Ventures. This part of the company helps startups that care about the environment. Chouinard's choice to give up being a billionaire shows how much he believes in using Patagonia to do good for the Earth. Patagonia's story, from selling shirts to helping the environment, is a great example of a business making a positive impact in the world.
